How one deals with the loss of even one child is traumatic. Knowing that 215 little ones lay in unmarked graves is a grievous mistake that must and will be righted, with God's help.

May God bless the good work you continue to do at the National Centre for Truth and Reconciliation, and may it bring peace and healing.
