"A voice of one calling in the wilderness, prepare the way for the Lord, make straight paths for him.... The crooked roads shall become straight, the rough ways smooth." (Luke 3:4-5)

Pope Francis: Extracts from address to the UN, Nairobi, Kenya, 26th Nov 2015...

'... An important meeting on climate change **UN** 'COP21' will be held in Paris, where the international community as such will once again confront these issues. It would be sad, and I dare say even catastrophic, were particular interests to prevail over the common good and lead to manipulating information in order to protect their own plans and projects.

In this international context, we are confronted with a choice which cannot be ignored: either to improve or to destroy the environment. Every step we take, whether large or small, individual or collective, in caring for creation opens a sure path for that "generous and worthy creativity which brings out the best in human beings" Laudato Si. (LS) 211'.

Francis believes that the climate is a common good, which belongs to all and is meant for all. In this context; "climate change is a global problem with grave implications: environmental, social, economic and political"... (LS 23). It represents one of the principal challenges facing humanity today. Our response "needs to incorporate a social perspective which takes into account the fundamental rights of the poor and the underprivileged" (LS. 93). Francis goes on to say: 'that the destruction of the environment is also accompanied by a relentless process of **exclusion**'.
